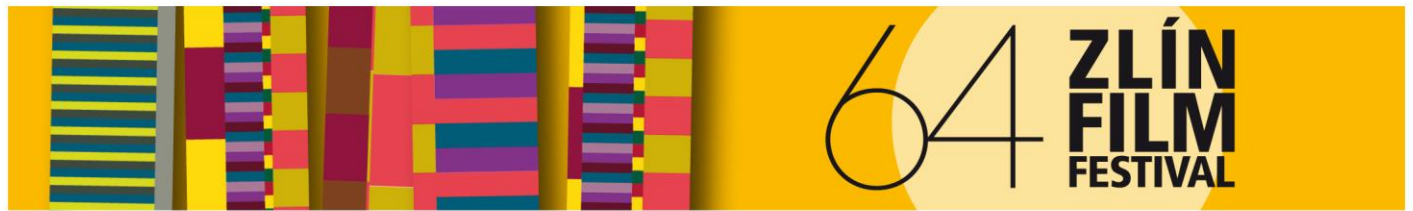

Through Rocks and Clouds (PER/CHI, 2024) directed by Franco García Becerra



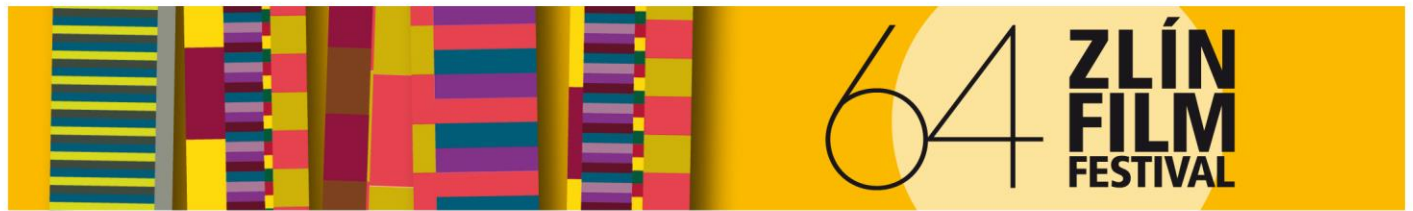

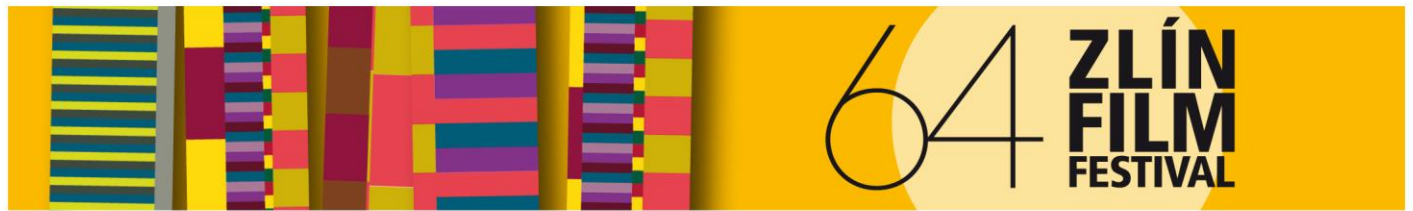

Young Hearts (BEL/NLD, 2024) directed by Anthony Schatteman



Exploring sexuality and scrutinizing stereotypes is at the center of this emotionally easy-to-relate story. The film contributes to encouraging adolescents to stand by their feelings against all reservations. 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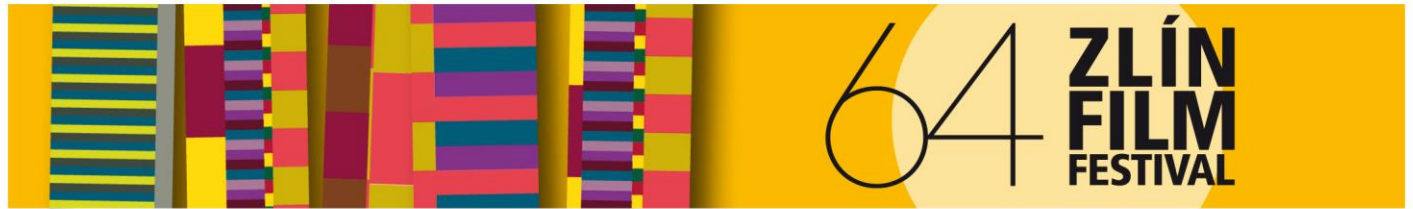
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Special Jury Award in a Feature Film in the Junior and Youth Category

Budapest Silo (HUN, 2022) directed by Zsófia Paczolay



A visually stunning deep dive into the life of the real working-class hero Józsi, a maintenance worker in a huge grain warehouse. Each day he embarks on a dangerous journey into the depths of the silo, reminiscent of a deep sea dive or the Stalker's expedition into the Zone. Constantly surrounded by darkness and by ever-present grain dust in the air which is beautiful and deadly at the same time. The jury appreciated that the film conveys the life of an otherwise invisible person with breathtaking sensitivity and extraordinary audiovisual mastery. It is a truly cinematic piece that reminds us of finding beauty and meaning in unexpected places.

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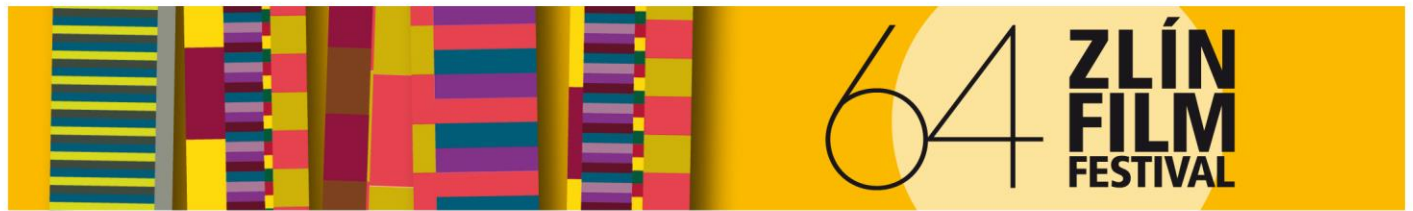
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Jury Award in the Documentary Films Category

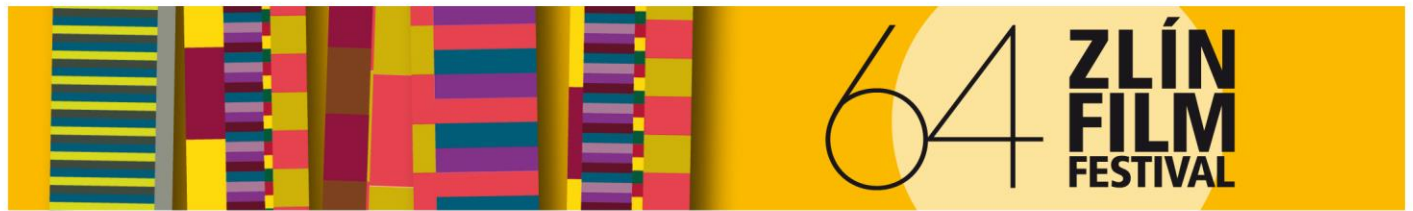

Ecumenical Jury Award for Best Feature Film in the Junior and Youth Category

Sisterhood (FRA, 2023) directed by Nora el Hourch



The debut film of the French/Moroccan director Nora el Hourch Sisterhood is a strong film about friendship, struggle for justice and equality in gender, social and racial/ethnic issues. Under the harsh surface of the everyday life in contemporary France shines the beauty of a story of friendship, dreams for a better future and identity for the characters of the film. The filmic language is a violent, outspoken and direct – Which gives it a strong authenticity. The film deals with very controversial issues of abuse and violence in a way that doesn't go black and white but holds a much more nuanced distinguishing between the deeds (sins) and the perpetrators as human beings with a spark of love. The main drama of the film is the clash among the three girls, the dilemma between the fight for women rights, social rights and the basic struggle to survive with dignity at the bottom of society.
